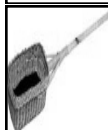

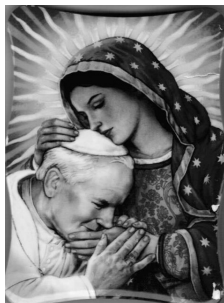

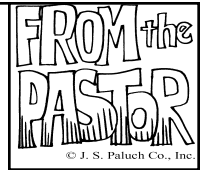

Dear Parishioners and Visitors to Our Lady of Guadalupe,



Well, it's finally here! Although it may not be a "big deal" to some or even perhaps to many, this weekend's official decree and dedication of Our Lady of Guadalupe as a diocesan shrine is a very historical and important moment in the history of our diocese as well as our parish. Bishop Galante's official decree states the nature, purpose and goals of a shrine. As mentioned in the canonical decree, Our Lady of Guadalupe has been given a special role within the faith journey of our universal Catholic Christian Church. She is noted as Empress of the Americas, Patroness of the unborn and the sanctity of human life, Mother of priestly and religious vocations and Patroness of Catholic families. Let us be committed to this effort. How much is Our Lady needed to protect and defend the sanctity of our Catholic families under assault by so many who would have the sanctity of marriage and family life reimaged according to what is popular and acceptable in some cultures today! As so many have heard me say, "The hand that rocks the cradle moves the world" and yet, so many others would like to get their hands on our cradles in order to rock the foundation of our family life. Pray to God through Our Lady that your family is kept safe from danger and the threat of division.

It is my hope and prayer that beginning now in for many, many generations pilgrims will visit the sacred image of Our Lady of Guadalupe in this Shrine in order to seek her maternal assistance and implore her protection. May we, the parishioners and promoters of this dedicated and holy place, never cease to promote this devotion through our perpetual novena to her. May we renew our efforts of evangelization and ardent participation the sacraments.

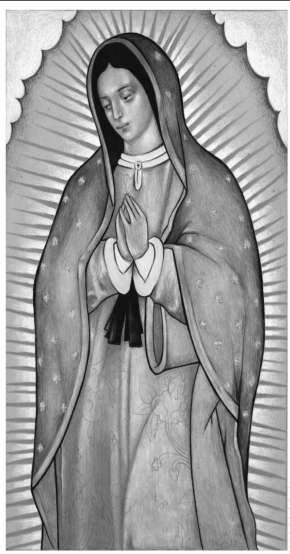

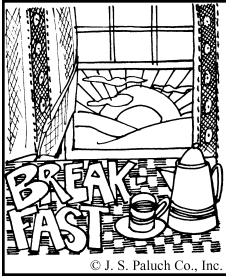

### CIVILIZATION OF LOVE

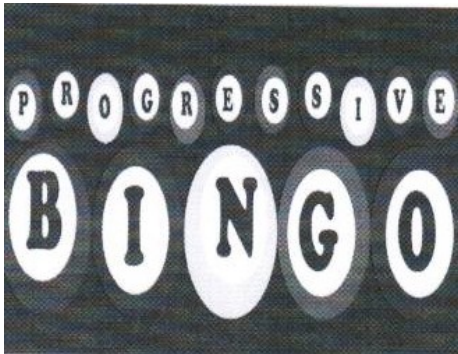
At last, Juan Diego was able to fulfill his promise to the Blessed Mother. Before the bishop and his servants, he unfolded his tilma and not only allowed the flowers to fall from it, but also revealed on its rough surface the image of the Virgin Mary herself. All present knelt down, overcome with emotion. In tears, Bishop Zumarraga prayed for the Blessed Mother's forgiveness for not attending to her wish before this. The bishop "untied the tilma from around Juan Diego's neck, took it immediately into his private chapel, and welcomed Juan Diego to spend the rest of the day in his home." The next day, Juan Diego and the bishop went together to Tepeyac hill, to see the rocky, barren place that would be brought to sacred life when the Virgin's chapel was built. After guiding the bishop to the location, Juan Diego asked for permission to return to his uncle. Bishop Zumarraga assented and sent several of his men to accompany Juan Diego, with instructions to bring Juan Bernardino back with them if he was in good health. Not only was he in good health, he was also brimming with the news that Our Lady had appeared to him and healed him at the same time she was appearing to and reassuring Juan Diego that his uncle was no longer ill. What is more, the Virgin had given her name to Juan Bernardino as "Our Lady of Guadalupe." There was nothing else for Juan Diego but to serve the Son of the Living God by humbly and devotedly caring for "His sacred little house" on behalf of Our Lady for the rest of his life. The subsequent miracle of conversion in Mexico that followed Our Lady's appearance to Juan Diego in 1531, however, contrasted sharply with the fate of the Church in Europe during that same time period. *(to be continued)*

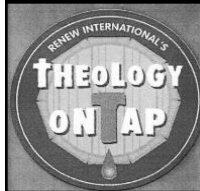
