Dear Parishioners and Visitors to Our Lady of Guadalupe,

The title of my reflection today is “Flash Mobs and Faith Mobs”. The first title refers to all of the negative press that has surfaced these past several weeks regarding the terrible, violent episodes of organized mob violence that has targeted innocent victims in Philadelphia. Through social networking systems such as Twitter, Facebook, texting and the like, young people quickly and effectively coordinate the particular variables needed to organize a crime and then execute it with devastating effects. Some of the victims have been the elderly, other young people, young single moms walking with their children, shop owners whose stores have been robbed and vandalized and countless other situations. The reasons for this phenomenon as well as who is to blame and what can be done are as numerous as those who report these events. Some of the reasons blame our society and culture while others blame the lack of supervision by parents while still others talk about the fault of the police and other law enforcement agencies. Still others quote famous human rights activists who spoke about what happens when those who are oppressed have “had enough” and feel as though there is no other way for them to be heard.

The next group of young people I would like to highlight isn't a “flash mob” but a “faith mob”. This group gathered in Madrid Spain for World Youth Day. They came from all over the world to meet with one another and with a white haired elderly man, Pope Benedict XVI. These young people spent nearly ten days in prayer, catechesis, fellowship and service. Like the first group, these young people also used social networking systems to organize this event. Like the first group, they too encountered other young people, the elderly and shop owners. However, unlike the first group of “flash mobs”, these young people left the city better than how they found it, in many ways beginning with their fine example of what it is to show the world what it means to be a Christian witness. In fact, I'm not sure if you saw any of the coverage, but some of these young people became figurative “martyrs” during World Youth Day.

I followed the actions of both of these mobs. I saw groups of “adults” in the city of Madrid harassing some of the youth that gathered there. They were protesting the high costs to the city and the country of Spain regarding the papal visit and the other social services that were required to support the gathering. Some of the photos showed young people in prayer while others were yelling at them. There were commentaries written against the World Youth Day gathering and criticized the Catholic faith, the young people, the Church officials in Spain and the list goes on and on. What a terrible thing for young pilgrims to gather and pray!

Firstly, not one euro was spent by the Spanish government. All of the costs were covered by the fees the young pilgrims, private donors and corporate sponsors. Secondly, some of the shop owners interviewed were thrilled with the injection of money pumped into the local economy by the young pilgrims. Thirdly, the Vatican provides all of the security and other support staff to provide for the Holy Father. So, the question then becomes why anyone would harass youth who gather for prayer and fellowship? I'm not sure of the answer to this question or why some youth choose to do exemplary things with their time and energy while others choose to do such terrible things against fellow human beings.

In our parish I know young people whose families practice their faith and make their faith the foundation of their family life. These youth have a much better record of making positive choices. There are several studies that attest to this fact and I can attest to it myself with many of the young people within our own parish and school communities. I urge all of our families to make an effort that as the Fall schedule begins anew and families settle into their routines once again, to keep faith in Christ as the most important aspect of family life. Pray for our youth and especially for those who make choices that keep them from being the images of Christ that they have been created to be. Also, pray for those who *do* choose to follow Christ and suffer for it.
