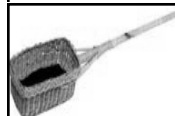

Dear Parishioners and Visitors to Our Lady of Guadalupe,

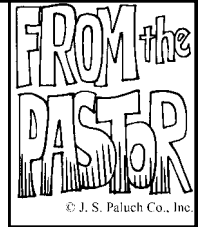
I always look forward to greeting people as they enter and leave Mass. Often times I don't get a lot of time with which to speak with them however, there is not a Mass that goes by when someone doesn't ask for prayers for someone or some intention. Last week, a woman leaving one of the Masses asked me to pray for an intention that, sadly, I receive very often. "Father, please pray that my children return to the Church".

During this month of the *Holy Rosary*, there is special emphasis given to Our Lady's presence in our church and in our lives. She is truly the icon of all Catholic mothers but especially those who experience any form of difficulty in their vocation as mothers. She is one who knew what it was like from the moment she learned that she would be the mother of God until that famous image of her in Michaelangelo's *Pieta* when she is cradling the lifeless body of her boy what the joys and sorrows were of motherhood. Even beyond the murder and death of her son, she remained confident that what God had asked of her in motherhood would be fulfilled. In Michaelangelo's depiction, he purposely made Mary appear as young as she was when Jesus was born. He said that he did this in order to show that even though she had been through such pain and suffering with her Son, interiorly, she saw the little boy she first held at His birth. Another aspect of the image is that disproportionate size of Christ. He is much smaller than Mary; not in equal proportion to her size. Again, the artist wanted to convey the notion that in her eyes, she was seeing the vestiges of a child instead of the ravages of a tortuous death endured by a grown man. This is why Christ's wounds are so small, almost undetectable. Overall, the artist wanted to convey a sense of hope that Mary had even in so tragic a situation. In fact, the rock underneath her upon which she is sitting represents *Golgotha*, the place of his crucifixion but yet, the artist wanted to show that this place which represented death was beneath her and she overcame it.

The message that Mary has for every mother who suffers with and for their children is clear: no matter what the cause for despair you as a mother may have for your children, there is hope in God and in His will for you and your vocation as a mother. As long as a mother has breath in her, there is hope for her children because she prays for them. As long as a mother loves her child, that child has a protector that is unconditional and her love for the child. I think that every mother experiences "pietas" in her vocation. Every mother holds some lifeless or life torn part of her child because this world does not spare any child. But just as the true purpose of Michealangelo's image is to instill hope when the viewer may see tragedy, so the true purpose of every mother's "pieta".

So, our children may not be in the Church as we would like, but never cease in your prayer and love for them and you can rest assured that the Church will somehow enter inside of them. And after all, this is always much more important. Mary, patroness and model of all mothers, Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for our mothers especially during this month.

CIVILIZATION OF LOVE

After receiving the Blessed Mother's assurance that he would receive a sign to show the bishop, Juan Diego returned home happily, only to find out that the only family he had, his Uncle Juan Bernardino, had been taken gravely ill. Instead of returning to the Virgin Mary the next day to receive her sign, he frantically searched for a doctor who would come to help his uncle. By the time Juan Diego found and brought a doctor, however, Juan Bernardino was close to death and there was nothing that could be done for him. Before his conversion to Christianity, Juan Bernardino had been a community elder to whom the villagers turned for help and advice in time of need.

After he became a Christian, however, his once friends and neighbors viewed him with suspicion. The villagers had heard that the behavior of the Spanish conquerors towards the native population was vastly different than that of the Spanish priests who accompanied them. In their cruel disregard for the native people, the conquerors did not practice what their own missionaries preached. All of this did not matter to Juan Bernardino. When he knew he was dying, he begged his grieving nephew to bring a priest to hear his confession and prepare him for death. So on the morning of December 12th, Juan Diego hurried off to the little church in search of a priest. As he approached Tepeyac, he remembered his promise to return to the Virgin Mary to receive the sign. His anguished haste on behalf of his uncle, however, made him take a different path in the hope of evading her. *(to be continued)*

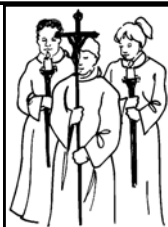

The schedule includes Saturday evening and Sunday Masses, special masses during the holy seasons of Advent and Lent, and other liturgical celebrations. It is important to understand that as a minister for the church, you will be needed on a regular basis and are expected to make yourself available for this ministry above all other activities.
